

KLAIPĖDA, LITHUANIA

If one had to describe the port city of Klaipeda in three words, those would be "tranquility", "culture", and "creativity". Klaipeda is arguably the most historically rich Lithuanian city that still exudes the instantly recognisable German spirit, and differs from the capital Vilnius and the second-largest city Kaunas by its architectural style, buildings, and winding cobbled streets. While life may be a bit slower here, the city's palpable urban character is best represented by the sound of waves crashing against the pier, and the gorgeous promenades that come to life at night.



CHAMPIONSHIPS INFORMATION

EVENT DATE

The Baltic Beach Sprint Championship will take place on 19th August 2023.

ACCOMMODATION

Lithuanian rowing federation will cover the accommodation costs in the **Hotel Aurora (1 night, 18 - 19 August)** for two athletes per country, breakfast included.

EVENT CATEGORIES

There will be three event categories in the 2023 Baltic Beach Sprint Championship:

Open events:

CM1x and CW1x (Solos) CMix2x (Doubles)

Rules for the coastal discipline require rowers to be responsible for making decisions in relation to their level of skills.

Please make sure your teams have suitable experience of racing in waves alongside their rowing competency.

Lithuanian rowing federation will provide coastal boats, oars and two boat handlers.

ENTRIES

Make entries: www.e-row.lt Entries are open until 16th August, 13:00.

After the application period, crew changes or cancellations shall be made by submitting a completed "Crew change" form to entry@lif.lt.

COMPETITION RACE FORMAT

First race starts with TT (time trial) when two crews racing side by side for overall best time to pass on to next stage. Heats are every 5 minutes. Rest of the stages will be in Knock – out racing. There will be a 7 minute time gap between the races, where crews will be allowed to adjust their boats and get ready. When down to the last 8 crews, quater-finals, semi-finals and finals will run immediately after each other.

BOATS & EQUIPMENT

Provided by Lithuanian rowing federation event partners.

RESPONSIBILITY OF TEAM MANAGERS AND CREW CAPTAINS

Teams are reminded that coastal rowing is an assumed risk sport and the Crew Captain shall be responsible to assess the risks and the ability of the crew to cope with the prevailing and forecast conditions (see World Rowing Rules of Racing Appendix R18 19.c.ii)

Crews that feel that they are not competent or confident to train or race in the conditions are expected to not go on the water and to inform the organising committee at the earliest opportunity of their decision.
